HU VOWEL PAIRS

Front vowels **eé**, **ií**, **öő**, **üű** are produced in the fontal part of the mouth. The tongue is in **high** position, so they are often also called the High Vowels.

Back or low vowels **aá**, **oó**, **uú** are produced in the rear (guttural) part of the mouth. The tongue is positioned **low** and **back** towards the throat and lends a guttural timbre to the sound.

Lip rounding goes progressively firmer as it applies to this array here: öő, oó, uú, üű
